Oakville Loader Training - Reasons Why You Need to Finish A Loader Training Program - Any individual who wants to operate a lift truck must take a Loader Training course to be able to become a certified forklift truck operator. There are several ways to acquire forklift training. Courses are offered through workforce training agencies, company forklift certification programs, and approved video and on-line programs. The cost can be minimal (or without charge) when offered by occupational safety officers on job sites or through employment agencies.

Forklift operators have to be 18 years of age or over, in nearly all countries. Local industry bodies approve Loader Training courses and need operators to acquire a certificate prior to operating this type of heavy machinery. A certificate is valid for four years in nearly all areas. Companies that hire employees to drive forklift trucks can face serious liability problems if operators fail to keep this certificate up to date.

Untrained forklift operators can lead to serious injuries and property damage due to incorrect utilization of the equipment. Training includes the correct driving and loading techniques. Workers should pass a written exam in order to be certified. A company will normally designate a supervisor to provide hands-on training to new employees. A licensed supervisor must have extensive training in forklift safety and be licensed as a trainer.
